- **3. DISCUSSION:** *Graduation Assessments Information* (Ms. Rosalind Poon)
 - a. There are 3 Graduation Assessments:
 - i. Graduation Literacy Assessment 10 (GLA10)
 - ii. Graduation Numeracy Assessment 10 (GNA10)
 - iii. Graduation Literacy Assessment 12 (GLA12) -- new this year
 - b. These assessments are not about "getting the right answer, but showing your thinking"
 - c. GNA10: Application of math concepts across multiple subjects from K to Gr.10 (5 numeracy process: interpret, apply, solve, analyze, communicate)
 - d. GLA10 & GLA12: Assess proficiency in literacy across the curriculum (use critical thinking and analysis from diverse texts, and communicate ideas)
 - e. Format of assessments (broken down into 3 sections):
 - i. GNA10 & GLA10: Part A: common section, Part B: student-choice, Part C: self-reflection
 - ii. GLA12: Part A: "Thinking critically about the texts", Part B: "Going beyond the text", Part C: self-reflection
 - f. will show up on transcript as RM (requirement met) vs. actual score
 - g. GLA12 and post-secondary? --waiting to see how post-secondary institution will use the GLA12 score
 - h. for sample assessments and/or to learn more, go to www.curriculum.gov.bc.ca/provincial/assessment
 - i. during PLT in the upcoming weeks, will hold Numeracy and Literacy Assessment info sessions for students
 - j. Assessment dates are set by the Ministry:
 - i. November 1-5: GNA10 (students in Semester1 Math10), GLA12 (students in Semester1 English12)
 - ii. January 24-28: GLA10 (all grade 10 students)
 - iii. April 25-29: GNA10 (students in Semester2 Math10), GLA12 (students in Semester2 English12)
 - iv. Technically there's a June sitting for those who didn't/couldn't make April sitting
 - k. Marking is standardized by Ministry: double-blind marked by 2 assessors, if discrepancy then it goes to additional marker

6. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT (Ms. Annie Varghese)

- a. Big thank you to PAC for the individually packed Baklava treats in honour of World Teacher Day
- b. Happy to bring back extracurricular activities (clubs, concerts, plays, sports); but still no external spectators yet (eg. parents from our school and/or from other schools)
- c. Student Council: is up and running; 39 candidates (for grade rep, general execs); campaigning will start next week, elections will occur on Oct 21st
- d. New digital signage: work to start hopefully next week at both Williams and Gilbert entrance
- e. Immunizations: since couldn't be done for last year's Gr.9s, this year will need to do both current Gr.9s and Gr.10s over 2 dates (1st date: Dec 2nd, 2nd: TBD)
- f. PLT update (have had about 5 full PLT days to date):
 - i. working group's next step (in next couple of weeks) = gathering student feedback via survey
 - ii. will follow up with feedback from parents as well
 - iii. still a learning experience for everyone; have gathered some anecdotal feedback from students just to get a sense from some students
- g. Connection Classes (Ms. Rosalind Poon):
 - i. had halted last year due to Covid
 - ii. 1st one will be this Wednesday, 20Oct at 9:20am (during their PLT time in the morning)
 - iii. Gr.8-10 students (run by Ms. Poon via zoom): focussing on getting to know themselves as a learner; "What does it mean to be a Shark? What do we value as a community?"
 - iv. Gr.11: focussing on personal passions (looking at different types of inquiry); how it's shaped by personal identity, cultural & community identity
 - v. Gr.12: Capstone project (requirement for graduation); showcase their strengths & challenges on their learning journey
 - vi. 7 Connection Classes in the school year (no Connection classes in December and March)
 - vii. 2 Conference Days in the school year
