## **Halloween Costume Protocols:**

As we look forward to seeing many staff and students in creative costumes, please be aware of the following: Thoughtful costume choices only please (that are sensitive to groups that have been marginalized through mimicry and cultural appropriation)

- Race is not a costume (black/brown face)
- Culture is not a costume (indigenous regalia dreadlocks)
- Religious Faith is not a costume (religious figures/gods/saints/grurus/hijab)
- Gender is not a costume (gender switching for humour or to mock)
- Trauma is not a costume (handman's noose/weapons)
- No costumes that cause a mess (dripping blood, confetti, loose feathers etc.)
- No weapons are allowed at all (including decorative weapons)
- Students can consume Halloween Candy, but no sharing of candy is allowed (covid food safe protocols and student allergies)
- No masks are allowed that cover a student's entire face (however medical/nonmedical masks that cover the nose and mouth are fine)

As we continue to practice equity and celebrate diversity in our schools, we ask that you be mindful of these guidelines and work with your children to choose an appropriate
