4. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT (Ms. Bronwyn Fackler)

- a. Program planning has started and the portal is open between February 10th to 24th. The students can choose their courses for next year. Course descriptions are published on the school's website for parents and students to view. Some courses have prerequisites. The students will receive their program planning sheets for next year, where required courses and electives are listed..
- b. The Indigenous Focused Graduation Requirement will be implemented in the 2023/2024 school year. This is a four-credit course and can be fulfilled one of these three ways: Integrated Indigenous focus in Social Studies 11, English 12 with indigenous focus, Advanced Placement English course with indigenous focus. Students who are in Grade 11 this year will be given priority to enroll in these courses in the 2023/2024 school year in order to meet their graduation requirements.
- c. Winter formal went well.
- d. Meet the teachers will be on February 16 in the afternoon for the second semester. After that, the counsellors will hold program planning sessions.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT: (Ms. Eliza Ko)

- a. Last month, five cheques were cashed, which totaled approximately \$1,500. The balance this month is about \$35,000.
- 6. **RICHMOND DISTRICT PARENTS ASSOCIATION REPORT** (Ms. Karen Pezzuto on behalf of Mr. Volker Helmuth) DPAC met on February 7, 2023. The DPAC Committee Chair reported that:
 - a. Superintendent Scott Robinson will be resigning this spring and recruitment for a new Superintendent is underway.
 - b. The 'School Calendar' sub-committee met and discussed that the Province is planning to make 'Truth & Reconciliation Day' an official provincial holiday (so far it has only been a federal holiday). There

will be no new impact on schools, as school boards already recognized the federal holiday. As it falls in September, it means that the first month of the school year will continue to have quite a number of days off. In order to lessen the impact on available teaching days, the DPAC proposed that the September 'Pro-D' day be scheduled as the first day of the school year, and when students return to school the next day, it be a full teaching day (not just a one-hour day as it is now). It is unlikely that this will be adopted for the start of the 2023/24 school year, but may be an option the following year.

- c. The 'Traffic' sub-committee met, but discussion focussed exclusively on issues related to elementary schools.
- d. No other sub-committees met.
- **7. NEW BUSINESS** (Ms. Karen Pezzuto)
 - a. Approximately \$15,265 of SLSS PAC's Gaming Funds have been allocated for the requests put forward by the teachers. These requests are attached. Funds are still available and teachers are asked to submit requests throughout the year for PAC's consideration.
 - b. Starting the next school year, PAC cannot use Gaming Funds to provide scholarships. Fundraising may be needed if PAC wants to continue to provide scholarships.
- 8. INFORMATION: Presentation from Alumni Association Glenn Kishi
 - a. The Alumni Association started in 1987.
 - b. The Association has awarded 212 scholarships to students, which totalled \$100,000. The Association also helped with school athletics, equipment, drama productions, music concerts. Most recently, it held Alumni nights and career nights for alumni and students to network. Other events included helping with reunions and supporting alumni for fund-raising.
 - c. Started applying for gaming funds on behalf of the school and passed on the application to the school's PAC to carry on, provided a portion of the funds are set aside for PAC scholarships. Gaming funds are not allowed to be used for scholarships after June 2023.
