- 4. **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT** (Ms. Bronwyn Fackler)
 - a. PAC previously approved funds for the theatre group to purchase licenses but the cost has increased and the group is requesting for an additional \$317.63 to cover the increase. The motion to approve was first voted by Kelly Hambleton and seconded by Volker Hambleton.
 - b. The considerations for School Scholarships are academics, community service, and financial hardship. Admin to give us a template for PAC to consider for the PAC Scholarships.
 - c. The Grade 8 camp will be during the second week of September at Camp Stillwood. The costs have gone up tremendously but the challenge right now is charting buses for the trip. Admin is requesting for PAC's support for the camp. Admin to provide estimated costs in the next two weeks.
 - d. Starting next year, the Ministry Affordability Fund will be structured differently but will continue to pay for students' basic expenses. It is not confirmed if optional field trip funds will be covered. If the Ministry's support continues next year, PAC may not need to set aside funds and can put it towards other uses.
 - e. A question was brought up about how SLSS determined its 200-minute Personal Learning Time (PLT). The question arose because it was noted that PLT is not consistently administered across the secondary schools in the district. The meeting was informed that consultation was very likely done for all key stakeholders: parents, students, district. Given that PLT has been in place for two years, there is an opportunity to revisit PLT in regards to duration and time of day.
