Personalized Learning Time

Students have the opportunity again this year to engage in weekly Personal Learning Time (PLT) on Wednesdays and Thursdays. This is dedicated time set aside in the timetable for students, where they are given choice and ownership over their learning. The goal of PLT is to teach students the skills necessary to use instructional time in a way that benefits their individual learning. For example, students can visit teachers to get additional help, work on projects individually or in a group, or engage in personal activities such as goal setting. PLT is centered around three Guiding Principles:

- (a) PLT will be self-directed, self-managed and self-regulated by students
- (b) PLT will support learners to be independent learners
- (c) PLT will focus on the development of Core Competencies: Communication, Thinking, and Personal and Social Responsibility

Please note that PLT will begin on September 11th.

Student Schedules

Please note that grade 9-12 students may log-in to MyEdBC on Tuesday, September 3rd and view their schedule. Grade 8 and all new students will receive their MyEdBC access later in September. Please note that timetables may change, as counsellors work to ensure that all students have complete timetables and all the required courses. Students' timetables will be distributed by email on Friday, August 30th and by hard copy on Tuesday, September 3rd during their homeroom classes. Current students will need to fill out the online course correction MS form via link in Friday's email, if they wish to request any changes. Counsellors will not be able to consider requests for course changes made via email. Please note that timetable changes will only be made for incomplete schedules or to meet grad requirements. The online MS form to request course correction will be open from Tuesday, September 3rd to Monday, September 9th at 3:30 pm. New students will meet their counsellor to finalize their timetables.

School Fees - SchoolCashOnline

The District Standardized School Fee and Yearbook fee have been applied to your child's account. Please note that purchasing a yearbook is optional for students. Grade 8 camp fees are already available for payment. Grade 12 students will see additional fees on their account based on Grad events offered this school year.

Our preferred method of payment is School Cash Online. Pick-up and Drop-off of Students

We encourage all students to walk, cycle or take public transportation to school as often as possible. Not only is this the healthy and environmentally friendly alternative, but it also reduces traffic congestion around the school each morning and afternoon. If you are driving to drop-off or pick-up students, please drive slowly and carefully on all areas of the school property. Please observe all traffic signs along our driveways. The signs are there for the safety of our students, staff, and families. There is no parking along the laneways at the Williams and Gilbert Road entrances. These are drop-off areas only. If you ride your bicycle to school, please lock it up securely at one of the designated bike racks located around the school.

Construction in the Area

Construction continues along portions of Gilbert (thankfully, North of SLSS). However, construction is now also on No. 2 Road. If you are dropping off students, we advise parents to use the Williams entrance/parking lot and allow sufficient time for drop-offs so students can arrive to their classes on time. Also, please consider having students walk, bike, scooter, or transit to reduce cars on the road and in our driveway. Please aim to arrive before 8:10 am.
