"We are delighted to announce the return of the Richmond– Wakayama Sister School Exchange Program, resuming for the first time since 2019. The City of Richmond has proudly maintained a Sister City relationship with Wakayama, Japan since July 16, 1973, and we are very excited to welcome a group of visiting students from Wakayama this November.

During their stay, the visiting Japanese students will experience daily life, as Richmond secondary school student, attending classes alongside with their local student peers and engaging in a variety of cultural and educational activities. This exchange provides a unique and meaningful opportunity for cross-cultural learning, friendship, and mutual understanding.

To help make this experience possible, we are currently seeking members of the Steveston-London community to host the visiting students on a voluntary, no-cost basis.
